"For half my childhood I lacked basic human necessity."

Demonstrating Our Positive Impact



The Need

23% of young people in New Mexico fail to graduate high school on time.

What We Do

Power Hour: daily homework help and tutoring

Career Launch: members explore a broad range of career options

Summer Brain Gain: a hands-on summer-learning program that prevents learning loss.

Our Impact

Among our teen members, 97% expect to graduate from high school on time and 89% expect to complete some kind of post-secondary education.

The Need

21% of high-school youth in the nation were involved in a physical fight in the last year.

What We Do

Positive Action: social-emotional learning, conflict resolution

Torch Club & Key Club: Community service and leadership groups

Youth of the Year: leadership development for exceptional club teens.

Our Impact

92% of club members believe they can make a difference in their community and 80% of teen members of teen members volunteer in their communities at least once per year.

What We Do

Triple Play: a comprehensive health and wellness program that focuses on mind, body, and soul.

SMART Moves: drug and alcohol resiliency training and education

ALL Stars: Organized sports leagues

Our Impact

76% of club members avoided risky behavior like drugs, alcohol, and physical fighting and 47% reported getting at least an hour of physical activity at least five days per week.

What's Next

In 2022/2023 we are continuing to expand our services to reach youth who need us most! With funding and community support, we will open sites as the need arises.
